Trustees' Annual Report

Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Charity is administered in accordance with its Constitution, adopted on 4th November 2009. Charitable status was granted on 10th November 2009.

Recruitment and appointment of Trustees

Trustees are nominated from among the subscribing members of The Friends of the Caird Hall Organ and elected at General Meetings.

At the Annual General Meeting of the Charity on 24th May 2016 Sheriff Kevin Veal was elected as Vice Chair and Trustee, Derek Buchan was elected as Treasurer and Trustee; Dr Peter Thornton was re-elected as Secretary and Trustee; John Brewster, Alastair Davidson and Pauline Robertson were re-elected as Trustees.

Organisational structure

Under the Constitution the Charity is administered by its Committee which comprises the elected Trustees and any co-opted member(s) along with the Halls & Music Development Manager of Leisure & Culture Dundee and the City Organist as ex-officio members. Richard Finch, as Membership Secretary, Andrew Macintosh, as Webmaster, and Dr Jim McKellican, as Archivist and Fundraising Officer, are members of Committee by invitation. The Committee meets at intervals throughout the year. Two subcommittees, concerned respectively with Education and Fundraising and whose members include Trustees, meet from time to time and report to the Committee.

Objects

The Charity's objects are:

- (i) the advancement of education of the public in the field of organ music and
- (ii) the advancement of the arts, heritage and culture through the preservation of the Caird Hall Organ and the promotion thereof to the public

and in furtherance thereof but not otherwise the Society shall undertake the following activities:-

- (a) fostering contact among all those interested in the Caird Hall Organ
- (b) promoting the use of the Caird Hall Organ in recitals, concerts and other musical and educational activities by a wide variety of groups
- (c) increasing financial security for the future of the Caird Hall Organ
- (d) supporting specific projects

Achievements and Performance

The Friends have continued to support and promote the magnificent concert organ in the Caird Hall – "the finest concert organ in Scotland". The Trustees met on eight occasions during the year.

The Friends were pleased to provide financial support for an additional recital in Leisure & Culture Dundee's 2016 summer organ recital series. The profile of the organ was raised further by the uploading on YouTube of video recordings of David Aprahamian Liddle playing music by Alfred Hollins, William Wolstenholme and Liddle himself which have now been viewed several hundred times. A "Come and Sing" event on Saturday 17th September 2016, led by the celebrated composer and choir director Paul Mealor, attracted over 140 singers from around the country and was received enthusiastically. Donald MacKenzie, organist of The Odeon, Leicester Square, London, returned to the Caird Hall on 4th November 2016 to provide improvised organ accompaniment to Harold Lloyd's classic silent comedy *Safety Last*; the programme also included a screening of *Dundee Courier – production of a great daily newspaper* by kind permission of DC Thomson and *The Courier*. On Saturday 25th February 2017 a successful Fundraising Organathon was attended by an audience of over 300, with six hours of music from a relay of organists, choirs and instrumentalists. The event raised more than £3,500 through sponsorship and donations for the work of the Friends.

Educational sessions including "hands-on" opportunities for secondary school pupils from Braeview and St Paul's Academies and St John's High School, held on 9th November 2016, were greatly appreciated by the participants.

The Friends have continued to support the maintenance of the organ by the funding of additional tuning sessions during the year. A substantial grant was provided for the installation, in November 2016, of a new humidification unit to help protect against adverse atmospheric effects.

The Charity's Fundraising Officer, Dr Jim McKellican, was nominated for an award in the new Fundraising Excellence category of Arts & Business Scotland's Annual Awards and it was a tribute to the success of his endeavours that, although the principal award went elsewhere, the nomination reached the shortlist.

A website is maintained, providing information about the organ and the Friends' activities.

At the end of the accounting period the Charity had 190 subscribing members.

The Friends of the Caird Hall Organ gratefully acknowledge grant assistance received from the following Trusts: Dundee Festival Trust, Tay Charitable Trust, Leng Charitable Trust, Moncur Trust and R J Larg Trust.

Appreciation is expressed also to Leisure and Culture Dundee, Dundee City Council, Susan Gillan, Halls & Music Development Manager, the Caird Hall staff and Stuart Muir, City Organist for their support of the organ and of the Friends.

Financial Review

During the period under review £2,090 was received in membership subscriptions and £3,430 in other unrestricted donations. Seventy eight members' subscriptions were paid by bank standing order. Grants totalling £3,100 were received from Trusts. A total of £1,754 was spent on charitable activities.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves adequate to meet anticipated expenditure and to accumulate funds to support future developments for the organ. At the end of the accounting period the Charity held unrestricted cash funds of £25,985. The Trustees also held £1,673 in restricted funds which have been provided for the purposes specified in Note 2.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The Trustees must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Charity during the accounting period. The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Charity at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the accounts

1 Basis of preparation of accounts

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) issued in 2005.

2 Funds

Unrestricted funds are those that may be used at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity.

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes. During the year, a donation of £1,000 was received towards the cost of the Schools' Events.

3 Trustee remuneration, benefits and expenses

No remuneration was paid to a charity trustee. Accommodation expenses of £61 were reimbursed to one trustee to allow him to attend the 2017 Arts & Business Awards Ceremony in Glasgow.

4 Membership

Membership subscriptions totalling £2,090 were received from 169 Ordinary members during this accounting period. Gift Aid recovery from membership fees and donations received during the current year covered the current year and the previous year.

Independent Examiner's Report

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 31 March 2017 as set out above.
