Structure, Governance and Management

Governing Document

The Charity is administered in accordance with its Constitution, adopted on 4th November 2009, revised 1st May 2023. Charitable status was granted on 10th November 2009.

Recruitment and appointment of Trustees

Trustees are nominated from among the subscribing members of The Friends of the Caird Hall Organ and elected at General Meetings or co-opted by the elected Trustees.

Organisational structure

Under the Constitution the Charity is administered by its Committee which comprises the elected Trustees and any co-opted Trustee(s) along with the Manager of the Caird Hall and the City Organist as ex-officio members. Two subcommittees, concerned respectively with Education and Finance/Fundraising, whose members include Trustees, normally meet from time to time and report to the Committee.

Objects

The Charity's objects are:

- (i) the advancement of education of the public in the field of organ music and
- (ii) the advancement of the arts, heritage and culture through the preservation of the Caird Hall Organ and the promotion thereof to the public and in furtherance thereof but not otherwise the Society shall undertake the following activities:-
 - (a) fostering contact among all those interested in the Caird Hall Organ
 - (b) promoting the use of the Caird Hall Organ in recitals, concerts and other musical and educational activities by a wide variety of groups
 - (c) increasing financial security for the future of the Caird Hall Organ
 - (d) supporting specific projects

Achievements and Performance

The activities of the Friends to support and promote the magnificent Harrison & Harrison concert organ in the Caird Hall – one of the world's finest concert organs – continued throughout 2023, the centenary year of the Caird Hall and its organ, and in to 2024. The Trustees met on five occasions during the year. Four newsletters were distributed to maintain contact with subscribers. At the end of the year the Charity had 207 subscribing members and one honorary member.

At the Annual General Meeting on 1st May 2023 a revised constitution was adopted, bringing the text into line with current guidance. No nominations were received for the office of Vice Chair and it remains vacant. Two previously invited members of committee have been co-opted as trustees.

The Friends continued to offer support, including financial assistance for Caird Hall public organ recitals, to Dundee City Council and Leisure & Culture Dundee, who are responsible for the organ's upkeep. On 6th June 2023, Gordon Stewart, Honorary President of the Friends, gave a much-appreciated recital in celebration of the organ's centenary, including performance of music composed by Alfred Hollins, the organ's designer. A successful Come and Sing event was led by Gordon Stewart on 30th September 2023 and over 120 singers had the memorable experience of participating in Fauré's Requiem on the Caird Hall stage, accompanied by City Organist Stuart Muir on the organ. An organ and piano concert by the Scott Brothers Duo, scheduled for 22nd October 2023, unfortunately had to be cancelled at short notice because of the effect of Storm Babet on travel arrangements. On 8th November 2023 a group of the Friends and members of the public travelled to Durham for an educational visit to the organ works of Harrison & Harrison and Durham Cathedral. The Friends' Silent Film Night on 10th November 2023 featured a showing of *The Flying Scotsman* with improvised accompaniment by Donald MacKenzie. *Flying Scotsman* locomotive was also celebrating its centenary in 2023. On 21st January 2024 Richard Bower presented an informal concert of music on the organ for a group of the Friends and invited members of the public.

At three educational sessions on 30th May 2023 primary school pupils, secondary school pupils and members of the public had hands-on experience of constructing and playing the *Orgelkids* miniature pipe organ under the guidance of David Shuker, professional organ builder. Discussions were begun with other interested parties in the hope that this may be the beginning of a long-term educational initiative across Scotland. Further hands-on educational sessions for secondary school pupils were held on 13th November 2023 in co-operation with local authority music teachers.

The Friends retain designated funds to assist with work on the organ which Harrison & Harrison, the firm which built and has maintained the organ continuously for more than one hundred years, have recommended to address a number of technical issues.

The Friends of the Caird Hall Organ gratefully acknowledge grant assistance from Leisure & Culture Dundee, Northwood Charitable Trust, William S Phillips Fund and The Leach Family Trust. Appreciation is expressed also to Leisure and Culture Dundee, Dundee City Council, Susan Gillan, Caird Hall Manager, and Stuart Muir, City Organist for their support of the organ and of the Friends.

Financial Review

During the period under review £2,877 was received in membership subscriptions and £2,718 in other unrestricted donations. Grants totalling £4,000 were received, of which £500 was unrestricted. A total of £3,468 was spent on charitable activities.

Reserves Policy

It is the Trustees' policy to hold reserves adequate to meet anticipated expenditure and to accumulate funds to support future developments for the organ. At the end of the accounting period the Charity held unrestricted cash funds of £22,654 along with designated cash funds of £20,230. The Trustees also held £8,636 in restricted funds which have been provided for the purposes specified in Note 1.

Statement of Trustees' Responsibilities

The Trustees must prepare financial statements which give sufficient detail to enable an appreciation of the transactions of the Charity during the accounting period. The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which, on request, must reflect the financial position of the Charity at that time. This must be done to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities and Trustee Investment (Scotland) Act 2005 and the Charities Accounts (Scotland) Regulations 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Charity and must take reasonable steps for the prevention and/or detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Notes to the accounts

1 Funds

Restricted funds may only be used for specific purposes. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for specific purposes.

purposes. The charity previously had two **restricted funds**: 1. "Primary Schools Events" (which is used to provide workshops promoting the Organ among local primary school pupils). 2. "Organ Upgrade" (which received funds towards a future major upgrade). During the year, a donation of £2,000 was received from the Northwood Charitable Trust, to be applied equally towards the Silent Film Night concert and the Scott Brothers concert (which had to be cancelled due to Storm Babet; this funding has been carried forward). In addition,

<u>Unrestricted tunds</u> are expendable at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the objects of the charity. If parts of the unrestricted funds are earmarked at the discretion of the trustees for a particular purpose, they are <u>designated</u> as a separate fund. This designation has an administrative purpose only and does not legally restrict the trustees' discretion to apply the fund.

The charity has two **designated funds**: 1. "Organ Upgrade", which will accumulate income to be utilised for a future major upgrade of the Organ. Specific donations totalling £230 were received during the year. 2. Secondary Schools Education for which a donation of £1000 was received during the year.

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and Examiner
